Stretching 117 miles from Franklin, New Hampshire to Newburyport, Massachusetts flows the Merrimack River, forming the border between the two states. At its origin are two rivers - the Pemigewasset and Winnipesaukee - whose convergence are beautiful, yet relatively unimpressive. However, by the time the Merrimack's waters make the long journey past our family's home in Lowell, Massachusetts and ultimately collide into the Atlantic, the river becomes a substantial and powerful source of life for surrounding communities.




